Position Description

Pacific Chorale Academy is a unique after-school choir program which combines music education and socio-emotional learning, offered free to low-income students in grades 2-6. Resident teaching artists lead weekly rehearsals which focus on social connection, musical skills, and fun. PC Academy received a national award from Chorus America for its impact in neighborhoods that have limited access to arts enrichment opportunities.

Any Substitute Teaching Artist will be considered for future full-time Teaching Artist positions that become available.

Each 10-week residency uses a set of pre-developed lesson plans and recommended repertoire designed to teach healthy, age-appropriate vocal technique, musicianship skill, and cultural context. The program takes place after school at each site, and students join the program voluntarily.

The Teaching Artist is part of a two-person team which also includes an accompanist.

Responsibilities

- Lead lessons which encourage healthy singing, cultural connections, and joy for 20-40 students in grade 2-6.
- Communicate effectively with students, site staff, parents, and the entire PC Academy team.
- Participate in regular planning meetings. All preparation time is paid.
- Work with staff and outside professionals to implement, document and evaluate the program.

Qualifications and Desired Traits

- Experience teaching vocal music to children in a classroom setting required.
- Demonstrated excellent musicianship, creativity and artistry as a teacher/performer.
- Strong classroom management skills.
- Interest and ability to be a motivational mentor and role model for students, parents, and peers as an artist, teacher, and citizen.
- Strong understanding of standard music pedagogy and solfege. Training or certification in Kodaly, Orff, and/ or Dalcroze a plus.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills and the ability to work effectively with a wide range of constituencies in a diverse community.
- Spanish, Vietnamese, or other second language skills a plus.
- Basic piano skills are required. Guitar skills a plus. An accompanist is provided at each site.
- Flexibility and creativity to adapt to curriculum goals and ability to work collaboratively.
- Ability to work during program hours as well as additional hours for planning meetings, professional development, concerts, and field trips.

Requirements

- If hired, Teaching Artists are required to comply with Pacific Chorale's Child Safety Policy, which includes submitting fingerprints for a background check. Tuberculosis screening may also be required for some sites.
- May be required to lift up to 25 pounds (such as boxes of music, chairs, music stands, etc.) either alone or with assistance.

Compensation and Benefits

\$50-75 per hour depending on experience. All teaching, planning, and meeting time is compensated at the hourly rate.
